WELCOME TO HARLEY SUMMER DAY CAMP

The Harley Summer Day Camp is a small neighborhood day camp for kids **Grades K-6**, with a low counselor-to-camper ratio. Our veteran staff is friendly and caring. Campers enjoy an active, entertaining—and FUN—summer experience, where they make friends, learn new skills, and take home some lifelong memories.

Located at The Harley School in Brighton, we have outstanding air-conditioned facilities, an indoor pool, onsite medical staff, and lunch and snacks are included. Camp runs daily from **8:45 am to 3 pm** with early drop off and Extended Day are available for an additional fee.

Day campers will rotate through various activities every morning with trained specialists in outdoor skills, sports activities, arts & crafts, and other fun activities. Daily swimming lessons will be provided by the aquatics staff. Lunch and a snack is included. We have various all-camp activities throughout the week. Past all-camp activities have included a performance by a magician/storyteller, bounce houses, color week, a talent show, or Wild Water Day!

Eco Camp, a fun, environmentally-focused day camp! CAPOEIRA SUMMER CAMP

June 20–23 Grades 3–5 12:30 to 3:30 pm Fee: \$155

Capoeira is an Afro-Brazilian martial art that combines movement, music, and self-defense practiced in a supportive community. Students will learn fundamental movements, kicks, escapes, songs, percussion, dance, and the history of this rich practice. We will hunt through the wooded Harley Campus for materials to make our own instruments for Capoeira percussion. The week will wrap up with structured peer review and tips for self-editing. The goal of the course is not just for students to produce a workable rough draft of the application essay, but for them to gain a better understanding of the college application process as a whole.

INTRO TO ROBOTICS – MICROCONTROLLERS, ROBOTICS, ROVERS AND BEYOND – INVENTING WITH MICRO:BIT

July 10–14 Grades 7–12 9 am to 3 pm Fee: \$385

The world is full of automated and remote-controlled devices—but how do they all work? Campers will investigate the fundamentals of electronics, coding and logic, delve into design thinking, and learn practical skills such as wiring, soldering, and even 3D design and printing! Using low voltage (3v to 5v) Micro:bit microcontrollers (small, programmable circuit boards), campers begin by creating simple circuits and basic code that controls different components such as LED lights, Piezo speakers (sound) and mechanical movement. After learning the basics, campers will create experimental projects and incorporate their own design ideas and imagination. Campers will have the option of using a Block Coding Language (MakeCode) and Python Coding Language. They will write code for their experiments and projects, as well as modify existing code and adapt the code to improve their project design's functionality. **IEANNE WEBER**
